### acute

### adjective

1. of great severity or intensity.

The patient is experiencing acute pain in the abdomen.

When the hunger pangs became acute, she allowed herself to eat a little.

2. keen; sharp; sensitive.

A horse has an acute sense of hearing.

She has an acute sensitivity to the feelings of others.

derived forms: acutely (adv.), acuteness (n.)

### chaff

### noun

the husks separated from grain by threshing.

The desired grains of wheat would fall to the threshing floor while the chaff would be blown away by the wind.

### dole

#### noun

a distribution of food, money, or the like to needy people.

### transitive verb

to deal out or distribute (food, money, or the like) in small amounts to needy people (usually followed by out).

The relief workers doled out the sacks of flour.

## faculty

### noun

any of the specific mental capabilities such as memory, perception, reasoning, or understanding.

# grudging

### adjective

reluctant or unwilling.

a grudging admission of error

derived forms: grudgingly (adv.)

## humble

### adjective

not prideful or pretentious; modest.

Although he was rich and powerful, he remained a humble man.

derived forms: humblingly (adv.), humbly (adv.), humbleness (n.), humbler (n.)

## implement

### noun

something used in order to accomplish a particular thing, especially a tool, device, or instrument to perform a task.

A pen is an implement for writing.

A radio ad can be your best implement for getting your business known in the area.

### transitive verb

to carry out or put into effect.

It's time to implement our plan.

<u>derived forms:</u> implemental (adj.), implementation (n.), implementer (n.)

# indefatigable

## adjective

persisting tirelessly; untiring.

The senator was an indefatigable campaigner and would be hard to beat.

derived forms: indefatigably (adv.), indefatigability (n.), indefatigableness (n.)

## leisure

### noun

freedom from work or other duties or responsibilities that require time and effort; free time.

Life was hard for our ancestors, and they had little leisure.

In his leisure, he likes to read mystery novels.

# manipulation

#### noun

skillful or devious handling.

### maxim

#### noun

a brief, concise statement of a general or basic truth or rule, especially for proper conduct.

My grandmother's favorite maxim was "A child should be seen and not heard."

## propulsion

### noun

the act or process of propelling, or the condition of being propelled.

<u>derived forms:</u> propulsive (adj.), propulsory (adj.)

## resolution

### noun

mental firmness, determination, or resolve.

Without strong resolution, she would not have risen to the top of her profession.

# toil<sup>1</sup>

#### noun

long or laborious work or effort.

derived forms: toiler (n.)
